While we don't have a lot to share with you, there are a couple of time sensitive items below.

## Action items:

- Matt Wilson is now the chair of the Experiment Station Section (ESS) and ESCOP. This places the region in a unique leadership position. If there are specific initiatives that you would like to see ESS/ESCOP pursue, please let us know.
- The Experiment Station Section has shared with the Committee on Legislation and Policy (CLP, also known as the Farm Bill Committee) a list of "must haves". (We've posted a copy of the "must haves" on the NERA website.) One of the "must haves" is modification of the Hatch statute language that clearly designates the "experiment station director" (versus "director" or "research director") as the chief administrative officer of the capacity funds. This makes the language consistent with Smith—Lever which clearly designates authority to the "Cooperative Extension Director". While the ESS has been seeking this change for some time, Lewis-Burke Associates, the advocacy consultants of the APLU, asked the Executive Directors to broadly communicate the change to ensure that all deans and directors are apprised of the ask and on board. If you have concerns or comments on the change, we're listening.
- Deb Hamernik has shared information and insight on <u>new capacity funds reporting</u>
  requirements associated with reporting on "Performance Site Locations" and "Project Abstract Forms".
  Bottom line: simple is better. If you have concerns about the reporting requirements, <u>please share those</u> <u>with us</u>.
