• Today is the *final day* (the deadline was extended through today) to make a room reservation in the room block for the 2024 Northeast Joint Summer Meeting at the Omni in Providence, RI, June 3-5. • NIFA has announced its 2023 Partnership Awards. NERA celebrates that the **Multistate Effort** was awarded to the University of Vermont Agritourism Research and Extension Collaborative and the **Effective and Efficient Use of Resources** award went to the University of Connecticut's Federally Recognized Tribes Extension Program. Remarkably, two of the four awards went to Northeast institutions. Great job to both institutions!

We reported in the NERA Supplement last Monday that the Regional Executive Directors were attending the annual meeting of the National Coalition for Food and Agricultural Research (NCFAR; NERA is an NCFAR member). One of the activities of meeting participants was to visit with congressional delegates (or their staffers) who were on ag committees: House or Senate-Ag Committees or House or Senate Ag Appropriations subcommittees. (We've posted on the NERA website the NCFAR leave behinds including the <u>FY2025 Appropriations Requests</u> and a one page <u>Farm Bill-Research infographic</u>.) Rick visited the offices of Senator Fetterman (PA), Representative Pingree (ME), and Representative Thompson (PA). The good news: each of the offices that Rick visited knew, appreciated, and supported the capacity lines, AFRI, and the Research Facilities Act (RFA). This past Friday, the House Committee

on Agriculture Chairman, GT Thompson, released additional details on the bipartisan policies and priorities included in the 2024 Farm Bill. Here are several pertinent links that include Rep. Thompson's <u>May 10 open letter</u>, the House Ag Committee's <u>Farm Bill page</u>, Title by <u>Title Overview</u> of the 2024 Farm Bill, and a Title by <u>Title Summary</u> of the 2024 Farm Bill. If you look at one page, check out page 21 from the Title VII Summary. You'll see that the first line in the Summary notes, "Supports the modernization of agricultural research facilities..." by providing "at least \$1 billion in mandatory funding... under the Research Facilities Act". While we're not there yet, the news is encouraging.

• A continuing ask: We are seeking Administrative Advisers (AA) for several projects as our NERA ranks evolve. Many thanks to the AAs that are rotating off projects. Projects that are seeking AAs include: NE2201 Mycobacterial Diseases of Animals; NE2249 Sustainable and Inclusive Rural Economic Development to Enhance Housing, Health, Entrepreneurship, and Equity; NE2333 Biological Improvement of Chestnut through Technologies that Address Management of the Species and its Pathogens and Pests; and NRSP8 Genomic Capacity: Building Applied Genomic Capacity for Animal Industries.
